

Urgent appeal for £4400 for educational work in Kaliro District, Uganda



In my recent report, I told you about the success of the work being done by Eric Kihuluka and his colleagues in the Kaliro District of Uganda. They had begun an extensive training programme with all the schools in the district and were already seeing the improvement in the standards of hygiene and nutrition, as well as helping people to work together as never before.

The impact of Eric's work prompted both the education authorities and the King of Busoga to write to Discover here in Germany to thank us for the part we have played in this.

Eric has been able to set up several training projects for this summer, and to raise over half of the necessary funding locally. To complete the plan, more is needed

May: 3-day training for a total of 145 local authority councillors and administrators: £950 – i.e. £6.50 per person.

June: 2-day training for 220 teachers and 220 members of school management committees: £1050, i.e. £2.40 per person.

These training seminars will include tree planting, learning the medicinal values of five plants, hygiene and sanitation and making black stones for snake and scorpion bites.

July: Quizzes and debating competitions in 50 schools: £1000, i.e. £20 per school.

Establishment of 10 school gardens: £1350, i.e. £135 for each garden.

Total required: £4350
