Rehema Namyalo and her colleagues Evelyne and Andrew recently conducted an intensive 7-day seminar for 29 people in Mpugwe, Uganda. The next such training will take place in Bundibugyo (a lovely name!) in October. Sponsored participants (£225) are welcome.

Christopher Nyakuni in Nyirivu, Uganda, told me his group came alive again after a 3-day refresher training last month. On Saturday the group will meet again and make aloe and neem ointment. They have been informed that they are the most active community group in the sub-county.
