I would like to thank all our friends and supporters who, through their generosity, have made this work possible.

Already this year our partners have been active. Rehema Namyalo and her colleagues ran an intensive training seminar in the Catholic Church in Bundibugyo, Uganda. Following the training the participants set up their own Bundibugyo Discover Group. This seminar came about through good collaboration with Busaruhilfe, another Germany based group that supports grassroots work in Uganda.

Robert Bwambale and 45 members of Vumbura Maliba, Uganda, were trained in Mango (but not only mango) juice and liquid soap production by Eric Kihuluka from Kaliro. Their aim is to take full advantage of the flood of mangoes that come twice each year, but only for 6 weeks at a time. The next step is to
