Discover News-sheet for colleagues in Africa Christmas 2019




Dear Friends

In our recent conference of Ugandan Discover partners, we identified some of the distinctive features of Discover. These included being non-hierarchical, being compassionate and generous, working with all - irrespective of status, tribe or religion - valuing locally available resources, helping families with conflict resolution, and lastly "unity in diversity". Jesus came as a helpless baby, but when he grew up, he challenged both the religious and secular conventional ideas of the time and created the basis of a better society which works for the well- being of all. By looking at Jesus' life and teaching, may we gain valuable insights for more ways in which our work could be distinctive!
