“I thank you for your support for vulnerable families. I was able to purchase food for 20 families headed by very elderly people, widows and disabled persons who find it very hard to get food to eat.

The families were all very happy and expressed their sincere thanks to all the donors. Here are details of 3 of those families.”

Mbambu Bisinasi is a young widow aged 30. She lost her husband in 2012 when she was 22 years old. She cares for four orphans who all went to school. She has no land and lives in a rented room and also rents land for farming every season.

She runs a small roadside food kiosk where she makes a small profit to support her children. When there is drought, it becomes difficult for her to get food for the children.



Masika Karen Nyakisande is over 60 years old, widow and cares for three grandchildren. She suffers from diabetes and high blood pressure and is now unable to work.



Kule Anastori Kyamukagha is over 80 years old. He looks after six grandchildren who were abandoned by their parents. He has poor eyesight, an eye infection in one eye and is too weak to walk and work.
